Lead Instructor, "Designing a Writing-Based Course" | Summer 2024 Will design and lead a three-week workshop to guide new and experienced graduate student instructors from across the UC system through the process of designing a writing course. Presentations draw attention to the differing philosophies and objectives of writing programs at UC, familiarize participants with the distinction between a writing-intensive and writing-based course, and model classroom activities and assignments. Workshop units focus on the development of a course overview, a single writing assignment, and a scaffolded plan of in-class writing and larger projects.

Instructor, English 1007: "Whose University?" | Fall 2024 Developed and taught a new course inquiry at UConn, Storrs that encouraged students to contextualize their own experiences as college students within the history and theory of education. Courses texts included works by bell hooks, Gert Biesta, la paperson, and Jodi Melamed. Major assignments included an interview project, a critical essay, and a groupdeveloped podcast series. Instructor, English 1007: "Coming to Terms with the Queer Past" | Spring 2023 Developed and taught a new course inquiry. The course introduced students to historical, cultural-critical, and professional writing through study of cultural and political movements that focus on gender and sexuality. Course texts include political manifestos, prose fiction, documentary films, philosophy of history, and historical scholarship.
